On Tuesday, December 21st, the Windham Endowment presented a gift of \$17,531 to the Windham School Board for the purchase of a Wenger Legacy Acoustical Shell as part of the Endowment's Windham High School Capital Campaign.

These eight panels will allow the Fine Arts Department to offer alternative programming and to use venues throughout the school, such as the gymnasium and the cafeteria, when size necessitates. Dr. Bass highlighted that the shell will play an important part in the school, especially when Windham hosts next year's Jazz All-State Festival.

During the presentation, the Endowment thanked Karen Sayward, Dean of Fine Arts for all her work. In addition Jared Cassedy, George Kendall, and Rick Sweetzer were all recognized for graciously providing time and expertise in developing the list of items needed to best advance the opportunities at the high school for both the students and the entire community.
